Annual Report on Republic Day Celebrations - 26th January 2023

Annual Report on B-Certificate Examination (10th – 11th February 2024)

The B-Certificate Examination, conducted by the 10 KAR BN NCC, was a comprehensive assessment of the cadets' theoretical knowledge and practical skills in NCC activities. Organized under the guidance of Lieutenant Abraham Lincoln and coordinated by student Sarath, the examination was held at Bangarpet and witnessed participation from approximately 700 cadets across seven colleges.

The practical session followed, testing cadets on drill maneuvers, weapon assembly and disassembly using the SLR gun, compass-based map navigation, and efficient use of walkie-talkies. The second day concluded with an OMR-based written exam comprising 175 multiple-choice questions to evaluate the cadets' academic proficiency in NCC principles and general knowledge about India.

Annual Report on C-Certificate Examination (17th February – 3rd March 2024)
